



Thomas B. Murphy Legacy Award

This award, formally known as the Longevity of Service Award, is presented to Southern state legislators who have distinguished themselves by dutifully serving their constituents during their years in the legislature and who have been active participants in the Southern Legislative Conference. Named in honor of the late Thomas B. Murphy, Speaker of the Georgia House of Representatives from 1973 until 2002, making him the third longest-serving House Speaker of any U.S. state legislature.
