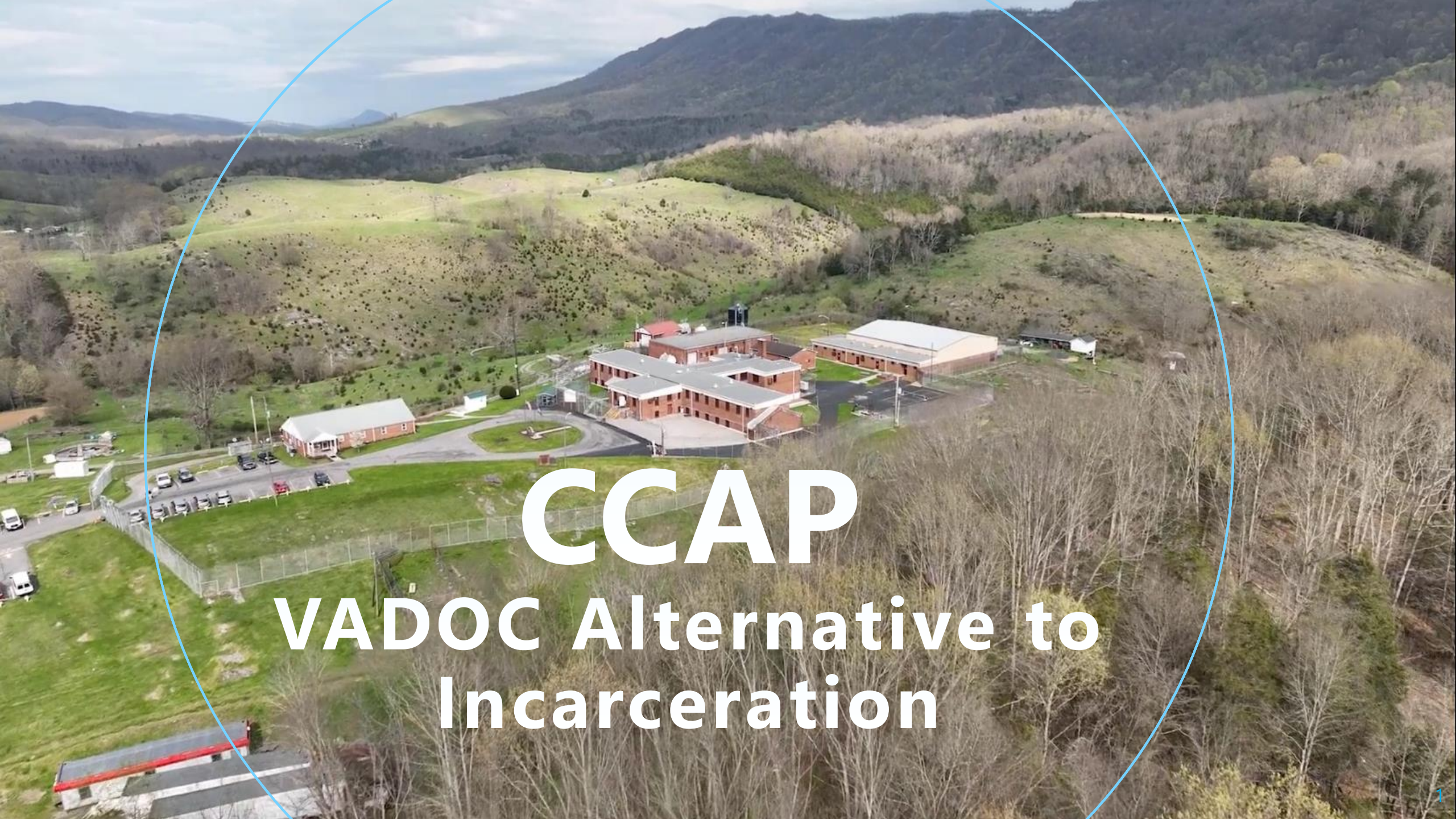

VADOC Alternative to Incarceration

CCAP Transformation



"Justice Reinvestment Initiative"

Prior Detention and Diversion Model was ineffective. CSG evaluation found programming was not sufficient to change behavior, focus on sanctions not behavioral reinforcement, lack of fidelity.

"Recidivism Study"

Over 40% of the population was low risk. Detention and Diversion Graduates recidivism rates were higher than Jail and Prison Control Groups.

"Opioid Crisis"

Virginia was at the center of the opioid crisis with many localities lacking resources to meet the demand for substance use disorder services.



COMMUNITY CORRECTIONS ALTERNATIVE PROGRAMS

Purpose

- Alternative to incarceration
- Structured, therapeutic environment
- Skill acquisition for long-term recovery
- Public safety through recidivism reduction

VA CCAP Model

- Centralized Referral Unit
- Risk-Need-Responsivity
- Minimum treatment dosage
- Evidence-based curriculum
- 5 Sites / 700 beds

Eligibility

- Active felony probation
- Moderate/High recidivism risk
- Moderate/High SUD or CBT needs
- Court-ordered referral

All probationers receive Risk Needs, Substance Use Disorder, and Educational Assessments upon entering CCAP.

CCAP Data/Program Effectiveness

73% CCAP Completion Rate

Graduates are significantly less likely to recidivate as non-graduates.

Recidivism Rate	Graduates FY22	Non-Graduates FY22
6 months	2.9%	33.3%
12 months	7.4%	41.7%

Note: Full implementation in FY 2023.

Vocational Education Services

FY2025, **74** probationers completed their General Equivalency Diploma (GED) and **312** completed Correctional Technical Education and Industry Certifications.

Substance Use for FY 2023

Before CCAP: **74%** positive drug tests
6 months post: **49%** drug-free with significant reductions in opioid use.
